MASK REQUIREMENTS

ACROSS THE CAPITAL REGION, MASKS ARE REQUIRED IN ALL INDOOR SPACES AND IN OUTDOOR SITUATIONS WHERE YOU ARE UNABLE TO SOCIALLY DISTANCE. THESE SPACES INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:



- ▶ Restaurants, unless you are actively eating or drinking



- ▶ Indoor attractions including museums, breweries, wineries



- ▶ Retail spaces



- ▶ Public spaces in hotels



- ▶ Personal care and grooming businesses such as spas and hairdressers



- ▶ Public transportation including taxis, buses, streetcars, subways, and shuttle vans. This includes waiting and congregating areas.

MASK WEARING IS EXEMPTED FOR THE FOLLOWING:

- ▶ Children age 2 or younger in DC; ages 5 and younger in Maryland; ages 9 and younger in Virginia
- ▶ A person is unable to wear a mask due to a medical condition or disability, or is physically unable to remove a mask
- ▶ A person is giving a speech for broadcast or an audience, provided no one is within six feet of the speaker
- ▶ When communicating with a deaf or hard of hearing person who needs to read the lips of a speaker
- ▶ The equipment required for a job precludes the wearing of a mask and the person is wearing that equipment, or when wearing a mask would endanger public safety
- ▶ A person has been lawfully asked to remove the mask for facial recognition or medical purposes
